



- Assess to which extent it represents a sustainable model able to address jointly food security, social inclusion and environmental issues





Questions

Methods

- Combining several analytical frameworks
- Five principles structuring the overall approach:
 - Integrating disciplines
 - Articulating the local and the global through five interlocked scales of analysis
 - Selecting sites and case studies and comparing them
 - Adopting a long-term perspective
 - Drawing together several sources of data
